

## Special Olympics North America Golf Invitational Tournament Coming to Hilton Head September 10-13, 2015

Volunteers Needed

Hilton Head, SC – (August 17, 2015) -- More than 220 golfers from U.S. and Canadian Special Olympics Programs will compete in the 15th annual Special Olympics North America Golf Invitational Tournament at Port Royal Golf Club in Hilton Head, SC, September 10-13, 2015. The Special Olympics North America Golf Invitational, presented by KPMG LLP, is seeking volunteers to assist with the tournament.

Tournament organizers are inviting the community to experience the joy and power of Special Olympics first-hand by helping fill an array of volunteer positions during the tournament. Volunteer positions will be assigned on a first come, first served basis, with registration closing August 31. Golf knowledge is not necessary for all volunteer roles; however, for volunteers with golf knowledge, specific volunteer roles are available. Volunteers will be provided with a meal during their shift and an event shirt. Volunteers under 15 years of age must be accompanied by an adult - no volunteers under 13 years of age allowed.

The event will kick off with a brief Opening Ceremony on Thursday, Sept. 10 at 7:30pm, with three competitive golf rounds held Friday, Sept. 11 through Sunday, Sept. 13. Awards ceremonies for the golf competition will take place immediately following the final round on Sunday, Sept. 13. All competition and ceremonies will take place at Port Royal Golf Club.

Special Olympics golf allows athletes to grow in the game as they gain experience and offers five levels of play for athletes with different golf abilities. Level I competition consists of an individual skills contest, where six golf skills are tested. Level II is an alternate shot team play, where a Special Olympics athlete is paired with a Unified partner (golfer without intellectual disability) of more advanced skill for a 9-hole competition. Level III is Special Olympics Unified Sports® team play, pairing Special Olympics and Unified partners of similar ability for an 18-hole competition. Levels IV and V are individual stroke play 9-hole and 18-hole competitions, respectively.

In addition to KPMG serving as Presenting Sponsor of the 2015 Special Olympics North America Golf Invitational, support is also being provided for the event by USGA, the PGA Tour, and the Coca-Cola Company.
