FUNDING

SOUCS is funded in large part by the Office of Special Education Programs at the U.S. Department of Education. From 2008-2023, over the 15 years of Unified Champion Schools programming, \$195 million in funding has been received from OSEP. Special Olympics state Programs, through their fundraising efforts, have contributed \$187 million in cash and VIK.
