Music can express the emotions of a song in a very similar way in that hearing it in different ways can help you to learn more about it. Whenever the teams at Cole or the High School shout out this team cheer, they are not only telling their teammates that they are a family, but they are also telling the world that they are a Unified Family. 12:30: KB...."Imagine being any sort of musician and making it big. Imagine having a top 40 Hit on the Billboard Hot 100 Song Chart...imagine have a top 20 hit on the Billboard Hot Country Songs Chart...imagine being the youngest artist to ever have a top 40 song on the Country Music Chart...All of this would be an incredible achievement for any person trying to break through in the music industry...now imagine doing it as an 11 year old. Billy Gilman broke into the music scene as a young man from Richmond, RI and has had tremendous success as a performer. In 2001, he was nominated for the Best Male Country Vocal Performer for his breakthrough hit, "One Voice" and he was named the 2001 American Music Awards Favorite Country New Artist.

Many of you may know him from a little TV show on NBC called, "The Voice". In 2016, Billy auditioned for Season 11 of the voice by singing Adele's song, "When We Were Young" and not 1 but all 4 judges....Adam Levine, Miley Cyrus, Alicia Keyes and Blake Shelton, all turned their chairs around in the blind audition and the fight to get Billy on their team started. Billy chose to be on Team Adam and after all of the battle rounds and all of fan voting during the live shows, Billy was named the Season 11 Runner Up of "The Voice"

An incredible musician, Billy also gives back to the community as he is a celebrity ambassador for the Muscular Dystrophy Association, in 2012 he collaborated with 18 other country artists to raise awareness and funds for the charity *Soles4Souls*, which is a shoe charity that donates proceeds to purchase shoes for needy children worldwide and Billy has also been a tremendous supporter of Special Olympics Rhode Island. A key component of the Unified Sports Teams at Cole is the tremendous support that we get from our parents and one of our parents, has a very special bond with our unified teams at Cole. Her oldest son, Joe, now an Avenger, was a 3 year varsity athlete here at Cole and was a force to be reckoned with on the basketball court. Her youngest son, Alex, is a partner on the Unified Basketball team and she has a very special message for all of us in this gymnasium. Please welcome to the stage, Ms. Leah Gendron.

1:00...KB...."Ok, now all you Patriots Fans!!!! We have a very special guest for you that knows what it means to do things the Patriot Way. A University of Georgia Bulldog, he was a running back, a quarterback, a receiver and a kick returner and was selected in the 7th round of the 2000 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots as a running back. He is a 3 times Super Bowl Champion with wins in Super Bowl 36, as the Pats beat the St. Louis Rams 20-17, a win in Super Bowl 38 as the Pats defeated the Carolina Panthers 32-29 and a win in Super Bowl 39, as the Pats beat the Philadelphia Eagles 24-21. During his time at EGHS, he was a multiple sport varsity athlete and during his junior year, he joined the brand new Unified Volleyball Team. As a junior, he helped to lead the team to the state championship game where they were the eventual runner-ups. Returning his senior year, he once again helped lead the team to the state championship game where they were, once again, the state runner-ups. But it did not stop there, as a senior he was a member of the EGHS Unified Volleyball team that won the 2012 National Championship with a 2-1 win over North Carolina in Salt Lake City, Utah. During his time as an Avenger, he was also a member, and student leader, of the Special Olympics Youth Activation Committee whose mission is "Youth empowering other youth to encourage the next generation to be inclusive of people with and without intellectual disabilities and not exclusive."

After graduating from East Greenwich High School, our next speaker decided to serve his nation and attended the United State Coast Guard Academy, where he was a standout star on the lacrosse field and earned a degree in Mechanical Engineering in 2012. Please welcome to the stage, from the United States Coast Guard, Lieutenant Junior Grade Kyle Carosotto and his brother, Matthew"

1:25....KB...We have a very special guest with us this afternoon. This past February, the Ms Wheelchair Rhode Island pagent took place at the Imperial Room at Rhodes on the Pawtuxet. According to their website, the mission of the Ms. Wheelchair competition is to "provide an opportunity of achievement for women who happen to be wheelchair users to successfully educate and advocate for the more than 54 million Americans with disabilities." Please welcome and give a huge congratulations to Miss Ashley Cabrita, the 2019 Ms Wheelchair Rhode Island.
