

 The treatment inside event venues and emergency medical facilities are free. The medical treatment service will be limited to primary care and emergency measures.

- 2. Management of general patients
 All visiting patients will be treated in the order of registration after filing a medical treatment application.
- If evacuation is deemed necessary, quick evacuation measures will be taken after contacting the evacuation hospital.

3. Management of emergency patients

- When there is an emergency patient, the patient will be transferred to an evacuation hospital immediately after taking emergency measures and the fire department will provide an evacuation helicopter prepared for emergency situations.
- When a doctor's judgment is required, the patient will be first transferred to a general medical center, and subsequent measures will be taken after the doctor makes determinations on whether to take emergency measures or to evacuate the patient to an evacuation hospital.

1. Emergency patient evacuation

• General evacuations will be made to designated hospitals such as Gangneung Asan Hospital or Wonju Christian Hospital, and in critical situations, emergency evacuations will be made to Seoul Asan Hospital or Yonsei Severance Hospital by helicopter.

2. Notice regarding evacuations to hospitals

- · Hospitalevacuation expenses incurred within Gangwon-do will be provided for, however, other expenses incurred at the evacuation hospital will be handled through insurance for those who are covered, and through personal expense for those not covered by insurance.
- Insurance coverage shall be confirmed at the insurance desk upon evacuation.
- Expenses shall be borne personally when wishing to evacuate to a hospital that is not designated as an evacuation hospital.
- Medical expenses shall be borne personally when evacuating due to a previous illness.
- Those not covered under accident insurance may receive medical service within the sports field area, however, the medical expenses added from the evacuation hospital shall be borne personally.


