Special Olympics develops and empowers leaders, catalyzing actions that directly benefit people with intellectual disabilities and their communities. By harnessing the power of people to change hearts, minds and behaviors, we create more cohesive and accepting civil societies around the world.

THE PROBLEM

The Issue

Throughout the world, people with intellectual disabilities and their families experience profound stigma and exclusion that deny them basic human rights, limit their access to essential services, and jeopardize their health and well-being. Despite this systemic marginalization, governments, NGOs, and private sector responses to pressing global issues overlook people with intellectual disabilities and their families.



Our Role

Special Olympics Programs and the leaders that make them strong – **athletes, families, volunteers and staff** –drive positive attitudinal and behavioral changes toward people with intellectual disabilities in communities worldwide. By empowering leaders, we create a more accepting and cohesive society.



Successes

- Special Olympics has global leaders coordinating grass roots activity in **170 countries**.
- Over 4 million athletes and their families and 1.25 million volunteers and coaches are engaged in the Movement.
- Dynamic portfolio of proven sports, education, health and leadership programming that makes demonstrable and positive impact at the local, national and regional levels.
- Passionate leaders strive to achieve Program excellence standards designed to benefit all Movement leaders and empower them to change the communities in which they live.
- Proven initiatives provide a path for families and athletes to engage with their communities, and to take the lead in breaking down barriers to inclusion and respect.

Limitations

- Special Olympics' brand and associated programming (such as Young Athletes and Athlete Leadership Programs) are not yet to scale in significant geographies.
- Activity in many parts of the world is episodic or fails to offer the full array of Special Olympics' programmatic portfolio.
- Limited local capacity and
- resources (financial, human and informational) to produce consistently high level of leadership talent required to implement and sustain durable, impactful programming and partnerships.
- Special Olympics training, evaluation and recognition tools need to be upgraded so that they help build competence and inspire a new generation of highly capable, impactful leaders.
