For me, I have succeeded through these family members to give example to others of what a real support of FSN means. and give the opportunity, with visiting regular trainings, to escape from daily problems and have fun.

A great accomplishment for me, was making Families to fight stigma attitude, and lobbying for the rights of the Athletes. A great accomplishment is always a greater challenge to keep going with the same speed and motivate more and more not only Families of the athletes, but wider surrounding to be aware of what a person with intellectual disability has, and that it deserves an equal treatment as the rest of the population.
