



PARIS TO HOST 3RD EDITION OF THE SPECIAL OLYMPICS UNIFIED FOOTBALL WORLD CUP 2026

After an unforgettable Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games, Paris will become the world capital of inclusive football in July 2026 with the hosting of the Special Olympics 2026 Unified Football World Cup.

Held for the first time outside of the United States, the event will bring together athletes with and without intellectual disabilities, known as Unified partners, to compete for the goal of being named Unified Football World Cup Champions.

PARIS, WASHINGTON DC, 17 NOVEMBER 2025,

Special Olympics International and Special Olympics France have finalized the hosting agreement of the Special Olympics Unified Football World Cup 2026. For the first time, France will host a Special Olympics International event with the 3rd edition of the Special Olympics Unified Football World Cup coming to Paris in 2026. The first two editions were held in the United States, Chicago 2018 and Detroit 2022.

From 5-11 July 2026, 24 teams (12 men's and 12 women's) made up of 324 players and 48 coaches will descend upon Paris to compete for the cup in front of 10,000 fans.

With the strong support of the French Public Authorities and of the French Football Community, Special Olympics France will have the unique opportunity to highlight the inclusive power of sport during a time when the whole world will be focused on football.

By far the most popular sport in the world, and Special Olympics' most popular team sport, football is the best way to showcase athletes with and without intellectual disabilities playing together. Across all Special Olympics regions, more than 450,000 athletes compete in the sport and over 1,470 footballers and Unified partners competing in France alone.

More than hosting men's and women's unified football tournaments, the Paris 2026 stakeholders aim to offer a once-in-a-lifetime Paris experience to Special Olympics athletes and coaches.

They are also strongly committed to building a lasting legacy for the inclusion of people with intellectual disabilities with the goal, from 2026 to 2030, of creating more opportunities for youth to play unified football in grassroots clubs, primary schools, and high schools in the greater Paris area and across France.
